

Cloud Journaling

Take a walk outside at three different times of day and observe the clouds. Write down your observations and do your best to draw the clouds you see. After, use your picture to identify which kind of cloud is in the skies!

Supplies:

- Pencils, markers, or crayons
- Paper (you can use the sheets at the end of these instructions)
- A hard surface, such as a clipboard or table



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Cloud Journaling

Instructions:

- Take a walk around your yard, neighborhood, or local park and look up at the clouds in the sky above you.
- Take out your cloud journal and record the time of day, what color the clouds are, how high the clouds are (low, medium, or high), any shapes you see in the clouds, the temperature outside, and any other descriptions you want to add.
- Next, draw the clouds in your journal.
- After you've finished your cloud journal, use the ID sheet on the following page to try and identify the cloud(s) you saw!
- It is common to see different kinds of clouds throughout the day, so make sure to continue your observations all day long!
